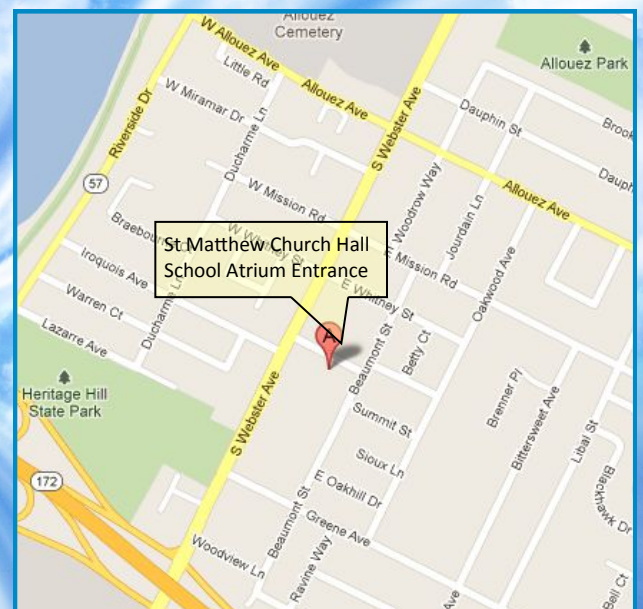

Ordained in 2002, he was previously the Pastor and Rector of the St. Francis Xavier Cathedral and Pastor of St. John the Evangelist Parish, Green Bay. He is the author of "A Shepherd Tends His Flock" and the presenter of the DVD series "Know Your Faith." Fr. Girotti regularly teaches and speaks about the Catholic faith helping Catholics and those of other faiths to better understand and to follow the way of the Lord Jesus.



Mary Armbrust: Mary is the Pastoral Care and Ministry Coordinator for the Diocese of Green Bay, supporting a variety of parish ministries, including: Bereavement, Care Ministry, Single Again/Divorce Ministry, Prison and Jail Ministry, and Parish Nursing.
