The Tour Operator, ITC Tours, reserves the right at its discretion, to change or alter any part of the itinerary, hotel accommodations or aircraft equipment, without notice. The right is reserved to decline or accept or retain at any time, any person as a participant in any tour, or to cancel any tour, unless arrangements are made at the time of booking. The Schedules and Itinerary contained herein are subject to change without notice.

TOUR PRICE: The passage contracts in use by the transportation companies concerned, when issued, shall constitute the sole contract between the transportation companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passenger. The airline(s) providing transportation are not to be held responsible for any act, omission, or event during the time that passengers are not on board their aircraft or conveyances. In the event the air carrier with whom the chartering organization has a contract to perform the air transportation described is delayed in performance or unable to perform with such aircraft, the provision of the relevant Civil Aeronautics Board's Economic Regulations and/or relevant IATA/ARC regulations shall govern the right and obligation of the parties.

CANCELLATION: All monies (less \$300.00 handling fee) will be refunded if cancellation is received 120 days prior to departure. Between 120-30 days forfeiture of \$400.00 deposit, plus any liquidating charges imposed by the hotels, buses and airlines will be charged. 29 days prior to departure no refund on entire package unless a replacement can be found. All cancellations must be received in writing.

OPTIONAL TRIP CANCELLATION WAIVER COVERAGE: The total benefit for any Insured Person is limited to an amount equal to the Insured Person's tour cost. In the event a person is prevented from participating in all or part of a covered trip due to accident bodily injury, death or sickness to himself, a traveling companion or immediate family member (which required the care and attendance of a physician) or other unforeseen circumstances outside the person's control, ITC Tours will reimburse the person for: A) the non-refundable, prepaid travel expenses (transportations, accommodations and other services) due to cancellation of the trip prior to the originally scheduled departure; or B) if interruption occurs after departure, the unused non-refundable, prepaid travel expenses and C) the additional travel expenses incurred up to the cost of economy air fare required to return to the original point of departure or to rejoin the original trip for which the Insured was booked. Any such additional travel expenses; however, will be reduced by an indemnity paid for unused transportation under (B) above. All refunds are subject to a \$300.00 per person handling fee. 

ITINERARY**Day 1 Friday July 19 Green Bay to Sao Paulo**

Early morning departure from Green Bay to Sao Paulo. All applicable meals in flight for the international portion of the trip. Domestic flight meals are not included; meals are available for purchase during flight.

Day 2 Saturday July 20 Sao Paulo/ Aparecida

Morning arrival in Sao Paulo. We meet our tour escort and motor coach driver and proceed for a short overview tour of Sao Paulo. A visit to the Luz Monastery (Monastery of the Light) and Art Museum. People pray near the tomb of Antonio de Sant'Ana Galvao, known as Friar Galvao at the Luz Monastery in Sao Paulo. St. Galvao is the only Brazilian born Saint. The Sacred Art Museum holds one of the most representative religious collections in Brazil. Only guide's voice breaks the silence to explain the 800 hundred religious pieces in exhibition, which are among the 4,000 that came from Churches throughout Brazil. Continue to San Juan Dos Campos for dinner and overnight. (D)

Day 3 Sunday July 21 Aparecida / Paraty

Today we visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Aparecida (Aparecida means Apparition) Our Lady of Aparecida is the patron Saint of Brazil. Her feast day is celebrated on October 12, which has been observed as a public holiday since Pope John Paul II consecrated the Basilica in 1980. Our Lady of Aparecida is represented by a clay statue of the Virgin Mary that is housed at the Basilica of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Aparecida. The Basilica, which holds up to 45,000 worshippers, is the fourth most popular Marian Shrine in the world. 7 million pilgrims a year make a pilgrimage to the Shrine to honor Our Lady of Aparecida. Continue to Paraty for dinner and overnight. (CB, D)

Day 4 Monday July 22 Paraty / Rio De Janeiro


Paraty is a preserved Portuguese Colonial (1500-1822) and Brazilian Imperial (1822-1889) town that is located on the Costa Verde (Green Coast). We will visit the Chapel of Saint Rita the oldest church in Paraty and home to the Museum of Sacred Art. Our next visit is to the Church of Our Lady of the Rosary and Saint Benedict. The church was built and used by Paraty's African Slaves. It dates back to the year 1725. Every year in the first week of December the festivities of Saint Benedict are held in this Church. Our final visit is to the Church of Our Lady of Remedies. The Church takes up over a city block of land. Construction began in 1646 when a woman named Maria Jacome de Melo donated the land for the construction of the Church. She had two demands: The first was the building of a chapel dedicated to Our Lady of Remedies and the second was that no one would harm the Indians that lived in the area at that time. The Church was completed in 1873. Depart for Rio de Janeiro for dinner and overnight. (CB, D)

Day 5 to Day 10/ Tuesday to Sunday July 23 to July 28**WYD Rio De Janeiro**

Attend WYD activities. Continental breakfast daily at hotel, dinner at hotel on July 28. All other meals will be at WYD venue sites. (CB, L, D)

Day 11 Monday July 29 Rio De Janeiro to Green Bay

Today we will visit Corcovado and the Tijuca Forest. Corcovado, meaning "hunchback" in Portuguese, is a mountain in Rio de Janeiro. The colossal sculpture called Christ the Redeemer sits atop

Corcovado Mountain and can be seen from miles away. Tijuca Forest is a mountainous hand-planted rainforest in the city of Rio de Janeiro. It is the world's largest urban forest, covering an area of 12 square miles. The Forest contains a number of attractions, most notably the colossal sculpture of Christ the Redeemer atop Corcovado Mountain. Other attractions include the Cascatina Waterfall; the Mayrink Chapel, with murals painted by Candido Portinari; the light pagoda-style gazebo at Vista China outlook; and the giant granite picnic table called Mesa do Imperador. (Due to the area the rain forest covers, our visit will include an overview of

the Forest.) Early evening depart for the Rio de Janeiro Airport for our flight to Green Bay. Arrival in Green Bay will be July 30. All applicable meals in flight for the international portion of the trip. Domestic flight meals are not included, meals are available for purchase during flight (CB)
