Hope-Filled Easter Greetings & Blessings to You and your Parish Communities!

We pray that you are well, staying healthy and finding creative, fruitful ways to engage with your parish leadership and communities in this unprecedented time. We have received a growing number of questions on the status of Parish Trustee Elections. Because many parishes have adopted the time of April through June to administer trustee elections, we want to offer these guidelines that you may discern accordingly.

The standard parish bylaws call for trustee elections to be administered at the annual parish meeting or at Sunday Mass. Given the Governor's *Safer at Home Order*, neither of these scenarios is currently possible. Fortunately we have state statues and diocesan instructions that we can draw upon (see links below).

The controlling state statute permits existing trustees to continue to act for two years, until their successor is elected (s. 187.19(3)). Since trustees serve for two-year terms, not all parishes will have to elect trustees this year.

Given that trustees may continue until a successor is elected, we recommend that parishes postpone the trustee elections until the Fall, provided the *Safer at Home Order* is lifted by then, we will be in a position to proceed with elections per normal protocols. If you are going to proceed with the elections before then, please contact us.
