#### Word of God Mark 4:35-41

Reader A reading from the Gospel of Mark:

(The reading is on the reverse side. Pause for silent reflection.)

Discuss these questions in two's or three's. Optional:

- 1. How are the gifts of faith and trust in God related? Give an example from a "storm" in your life?
- 2. How could you respond to a person of faith whose fears were paralyzing him or her?

#### Response

- "A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat." Side 1
- Side 2 When times seem overwhelming, just like that squall, we can turn to Jesus for help.
- Side 1 "Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion."
- What a touching detail, reminding us that we can relate to Jesus as human. Side 2 Jesus is God's gift to us.

- Side 1 "He asked them, 'Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?""
- Side 2 Could Jesus say the same to us today? We pray for the gift of faith, especially in fearful times.
