Opening Prayer

Word of God Mark 10:35-45

Reader A reading from the Gospel of Mark

(Pause for silent reflection)

Optional Discuss these questions in two's or three's.

The reading is on the reverse side.

- 1. What leader has been an example to you of servant leadership?
- 2. How is service with humility especially needed within our families, parishes and places of work?

Response (Mark 10:35-45)

Side 1 "Are you able to drink the cup that I drink?"

Side 2 When serving others becomes demanding and exhausting, we ask for the gifts of generosity and

courage.

Side 1 "Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant."

Side 2 Bless leaders with the humility that respects others and puts their needs first.

Side 1 "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for

many."

Side 2 May Jesus' words and example of service inspire us and become our own.

Petitions Individuals add intentions to remember here.
