- Side 2 Increase our faith so that we persevere in daily prayer for our personal needs and the needs of our world.
- Side 1 "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?"
- Side 2 We thank you, loving God, for helping us to recognize how you answer our prayers.
- Side 1 "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"
- Side 2 May we be among those Jesus finds faithful to the end.
