Response	(from Matthew 22:1-10)	
Side 1	"He said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come.""	
Side 2	Jesus has invited us to the feast by our baptism. May we accept the invitation by how we live our lives.	
Side 1	"Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find."	
Side 2	God's invitation to faith is offered to everyone, everywhere, at all times.	
Side 1	"The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."	
Side 2	Since we have been invited to God's feast, may we accept the invitation and celebrate with humility and gratitude.

Matthew 22:1-10
