Optional Discuss these questions in two's or three's.

- 1. How often do you weigh the importance of active listening to God's word in Scripture?
- 2. Relate an occasion when your focus on someone's words brought you peace and joy.

Response (Luke 10:38-42)

- Side 1 "Mary...sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak."
- Side 2 Following Mary's example of a disciple, may we listen for God's direction in our lives through the many messages God offers us daily.
- Side 1 "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things..."
- Side 2 Praying and acting with trust rather than anxiety and worry allows God's peace to fill us.
- Side 1 "Mary has chosen the better part and it shall not be taken from her."
- Side 2 Choosing calm and confidence in our actions allows God to work marvels through us.
