Introduction

Word of God John 20:19-23

Reader A reading from the Gospel of John (Pause for silent reflection)

Optional: Discuss these questions in two's or three's. *The reading is on the reverse side*

1. What experiences have increased your faith in the peace that Jesus brings?
2. Jesus breathed on his disciples to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. When have you received an awareness of the gift of the Holy Spirit?

Response (From John 20:19-23)

Side 1 Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

Side 2 Let us celebrate the gift of peace that Jesus has given us through his Spirit dwelling within each of us.

Side 1 "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Side 2 We renew our commitment to continue Jesus' works of love and forgiveness.

Side 1 "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Side 2 May we live out Jesus' command to forgive one another just as he has forgiven us.

Closing Prayer
