Introduction

Leader Gifts from God are diverse: personal talents, generous income, good health, loving families and many others. God asks us to be prepared to share these gifts for the sake of others.

Opening Prayer

All Generous God, your gifts to us are never ending. Help us to recognize, develop and share these gifts in ways that show our gratitude. May we not take your gifts for granted but return them multiplied and available for service to your people. We pray through Jesus who has taught us the Way. Amen.

Word of God Matthew 25:19-30

Reader A reading from the Gospel of Matthew *(The reading is on the reverse side.)*
Pause for silent reflection after the reading.)

Optional Discuss these questions in two's or three's.

- Jesus tells us how serious it is not to use wisely the gifts God has given us. What does that mean for your life?
- List the categories of gifts from God in your life. How full and wisely are you using these gifts?

Response (Taken from Matthew 25:19-30)

Side one “Well done, my good and faithful servant, since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities.”

Side 2 When God gives us gifts, he expects us to use them well.

Side 1 “Come share your master’s joy.”

Side 2 How we long to hear Jesus’ words.

Side 1 “For everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich.”

Side 2 Since money is not the message here, it is gifts of goodness which will enrich us and others.

Petitions Individuals add intentions to remember here.

All Gracious God, your gifts generously given are meant to enrich our lives and the lives of others. May we recognize, give thanks and use our gifts faithfully. We pray in Jesus’ name. Amen.
