Word of God Luke 1:26-38

Reader A reading from the Gospel of Luke (The reading is on the reverse side.

Pause for silent reflection after the reading.)

Optional Discuss these questions in two's or three's.

How has Mary's example affected your life as a committed follower of Jesus?

Discuss Mary's strength. How can you relate this to your life today?

Response (Taken from Luke 1:26-38)

Side 1 "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God."

Side 2 In times of doubt and fear, may remembering Mary's trust in God's protection help us

deal with our concerns.

Side 1 "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son and you will name him Jesus."

Side 2 How grateful we are for the Incarnation, the gift of Jesus, both God and human!

Side 1 "Mary said, 'Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to

your word.""

Side 2 Lord, give us the gift of trust that you can accomplish your will in us as individuals and

as a people dedicated to your service.

Individuals add intentions to remember here. **Petitions**

All Generous God, we thank you for Mary as our model of trust. Help us to trust your word

by reflecting on your teachings so that Jesus can be born in us. We ask this in his name

with gratitude for Mary's gracious response. Amen.
