Re:	Spring Thaw Safety Tips

Spring is an ideal time to inspect in and around your buildings for wear and tear and safety hazards. From cracked foundations to clogged gutters to heaving sidewalks, improperly maintained buildings can lead to possible injuries as well as expensive repairs down the road. Consider the following safety tips:

Interior:

- Make sure your sump pump and/or back flow valves are working properly.
- Inspect your basement foundation for cracks that will allow water seepage and initiate repairs.
- Check the attic for moisture and surface discoloration that could occur from roof damage.

Exterior:

- Inspect sidewalks and parking lots for cracks, heaving, potholes and other damage due to the shifting ground. Use cones, hi-vis paint / tape, or other means of attention grabbers to protect employees, guests and parishioners until a permanent fix can be made.
- Look for pools of melted snow during the daytime. These pools may turn to black ice overnight and need to be addressed prior to employees, guests and parishioners walking or driving in the area. Put out ice melt before leaving at night and then check for ice again the next morning before buildings open.
- Sweep up loose gravel or dirt on playgrounds to eliminate slips.
- Clear gutters, downspouts, and window wells. Repair leaks and loose gutters, and make sure water can flow off your roof and away from your foundation and basement windows.
- Repair loose or damaged siding.
- Clear drainage ditches and culverts. Remove all debris to keep water flowing into sewers.
- Be sure exterior walls are well painted and sealed.
