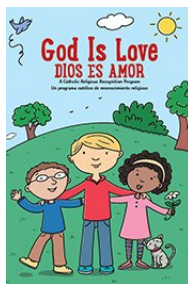

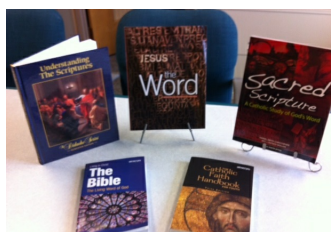

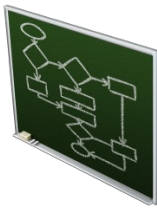


Camp Franciscan
