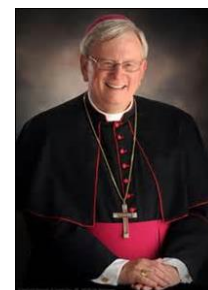
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Bishop Requests You to Save a Date

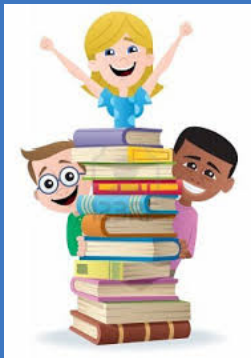

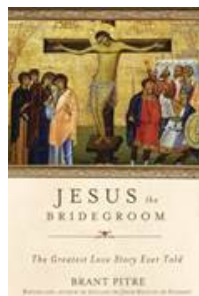

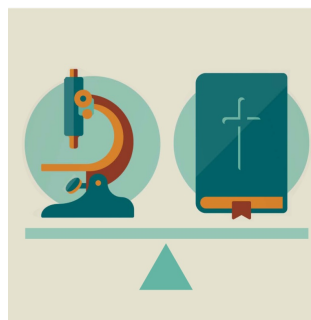

Host an Ongoing Formation Class in 2017

Suitable as Parish Adult Faith Formation, too!



Integrating Science and Christianity is a course to assist in understanding and teaching the fullness of both science and Christianity. Our pursuit of truth will bring together both the objective truths of nature discovered by science and the spiritual truths taught by Jesus.

Topics include: problems with making science a religion; limits of science, physics, cosmology, evolution; human origin; purpose; beauty; and errors arguing for a conflict between science and Christianity. The instructor, Warren Johnson, has a PhD in Biochemistry and many years experience teaching university science courses. The textbook for this course is: Baglow, Christopher T., *Faith Science & Reason*, Midwest Theological Forum, Woodridge, IL, 2012.

The course is conducted over five, 2-hour sessions, and Dr. Johnson is willing to come to your location at no cost to lead the course.

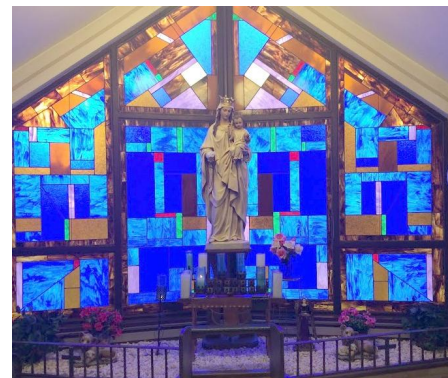

Catechetical Leadership Day in March: RE Accreditation Informational Meeting

What does a great Religious Education program look like? The accreditation process uses a team of people from within the Diocese to affirm, encourage, and challenge parishes to **evangelize with enthusiasm, pray with intentionality, and catechize with truth and charity** according to the Diocesan Quality



St. Isidore the Farmer Parish Rel. Educ. program, Tisch Mills, was accredited in 2015.

Indicators. The Diocesan Quality Indicators highlight 12 general areas and corresponding sub-points which outline what a great program looks like. The accreditation members visit the parish and affirm and challenge them using the Diocesan Quality Indicators as a basic rubric.

Come to this informational meeting to learn the benefits and the process of accreditation. This meeting is the **required first step** in the accreditation process. All interested parties are invited (Pastors, DRE's, Board Members, RE support staff). This meeting will be repeated in November 2017 and then once again in March of 2018.
