In the training materials you will find the topics and the discussion questions for each session. At our December 4 training we tried to tailor the training to educators. Thus you will see a lot of information in the first part of the training materials that may not apply as well to schools (such as 120 minute sessions). You do need to make the sessions, settings, and timeframes appropriate for your local school setting. For the videos, there are several options; we encourage the first set which has three presenters. You will note there is one set of videos for youth. That may be something to consider for the future with middle/high school students. Keep in mind that the purpose of Alpha is deepening our personal relationship with Jesus. It is not a practical training for classroom strategies, though some applications can surely be made. 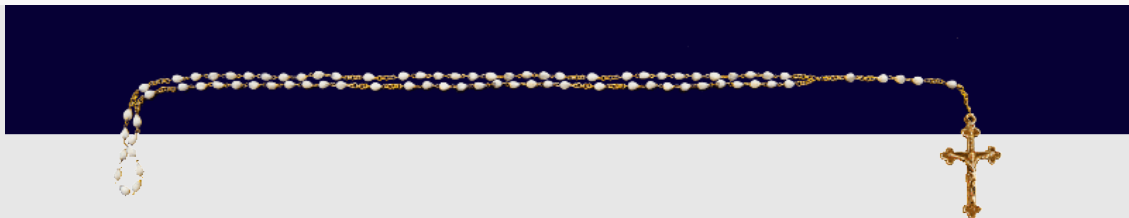
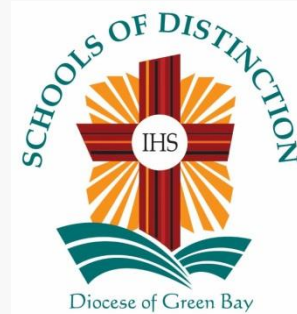
If you are looking for content materials for Middle School science or religion check out free, new materials from the Fr. Robert Spitzer, The Magis Center.

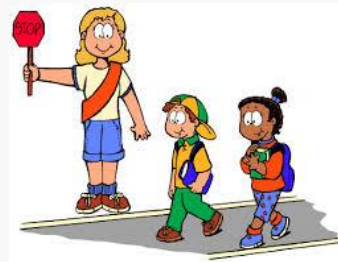


VIRTUS Training Bulletins

Tax Laws

Our national affiliate, the Council For American Private Education (CAPE) reports that the legislation signed by President Trump in late December includes:

Expansion of 529 Accounts – Starting in 2018, these accounts can be used for up to \$10,000 in tuition expenses annually in elementary and secondary schools.

Section 117(d) – Tax-free tuition reductions for the children of teachers and other employees in our schools remain intact.

Section 127(a) – Tax-free benefits of up to \$5,250 annually for educational assistance to employees are retained.

Teacher Tax Deduction – Educators can still take the \$250 above-the-line deduction for expenses for classroom materials or professional development.

Schools across Wisconsin and our counterpart CAPE groups across the country participated in this effort, generating tens of thousands of contacts with Congress. It was clearly successful and shows we are stronger together. Thank you for your membership in WCRIS and for helping us accomplish this victory on behalf of our schools, students and families!



Forward Exam



CESA 6 is handling private school access to the FORWARD exam under contract with the DPI. This special reduced pricing and the support it includes is a direct result of the WCRIS Board meeting with Dr. Evers last February. That dialogue opened the door for collaboration over many months and led to this creative solution. Whether or not your schools use the FORWARD Exam, this lower price will provide significant savings for many of our schools and underscores the value of WCRIS' advocacy on their behalf. See brochure [here](#). We want you to know this is available to our schools. However, we will continue to use NWEA MAP as the standard assessment for all our school.



Wisconsin Teacher Licenses

Truly, we have no updates yet. WCRIS and DPI continue to draft the legislative proposals (trailer bill) that will update the new life- license law to address non-public school teacher concerns and clarify implementation.

Initial educators (regardless of year they are in) will be issued a provisional license because that license needs to be in the database before a lifetime license can be applied for and granted. There will be a process in place to verify semesters of employment but it is not yet determined.

Educators with a license that expires June 30, 2018 do not seek renewal. Current life license holders should not expect their licenses to be deactivated. Once the rules are defined, all educators will learn what to do. The expected timeline for rule clarification is sometime in March. The process for employment verification and criminal background checks is not defined yet.

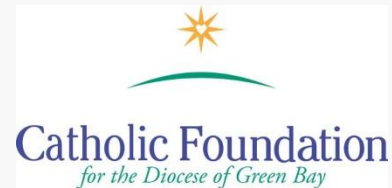

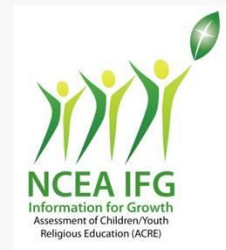

March is ACRE Month

The NCEA IFG: ACRE edition is based on the Catholic Church's expectations for an organic, systematic, and comprehensive education in Christian discipleship.

Currently, it is the only tool that provides national scores for comparison and processes for tracking religious education program data over time, and Bishop Ricken has directed that all Catholic schools and parish Religious Education programs in the Diocese will use the ACRE Assessment sometime during the month of March.
